Charlie Barra planted his first vineyard in 1955 in Redwood Valley, CA. Over the years, he became known as the "godfather of grape growing" in Mendocino County. The Barra's were farmers first. It wasn't until 1997 that they launched their first brand, BARRA of Mendocino, followed by Girasole Vineyards in 2003.

Today, Charlie's wife Martha and her children Shelley & Shawn continue to build on Charlie's legacy, farming over 300 acres of organically grown grapes in Mendocino County.
